## About Centurion Pipeline, L.P.

Centurion Pipeline L.P. gathers and transports crude Oil from the Permian Basin of West Texas and Southeastern New Mexico to Cushing, OK, Midland, TX and Colorado City, TX. There are approximately 1,800 miles of active transmission pipelines and approximately 1,000 miles of active gathering pipeline extending from the Permian Basin (southeast New Mexico and West Texas) to Cushing, Oklahoma. The System throughput is approximately 500,000 bbl/d with over 5.2 million barrels of total active storage capacity. In the southeast corner of New Mexico, and in the Permian Basin of west and central Texas, the pipeline crosses sparsely populated, flat, agricultural or oil-producing acreage. The pipeline continues in a north to northeasterly direction across north Texas and into OK, where it terminates at Cushing, OK.
